

Omdat-ul-Omrah, the Nawab of Carnatic. The second Indian Mason was M. Bandeh Ali Khan, initiated in Marine Lodge, Calcutta in 1812.

* The first Hindu to be admitted into Freemasonry

Bro. Ranganath Sastry in Lodge Perfect Unanimity No. 233, Madras in 1857.

* Some of the prominent Indians who were Freemasons.





KNOW YOUR LODGE

Warranted on the 23rd of August 1862 as 926 EC (English Constitution) The Mount Lodge was the third lodge in the then city of Madras. Other two being LODGE PERFECT UNANIMITY (150 EC) & LODGE UNIVERSAL CHARITY (No 272 EC)

The Consecration and Installation of the first Master **Bro. J R MAGRETH** on 24th June 1862 under a local warrant dated 21.6.1862, appears to have taken place in the residence of Bro Magreth.

Age of the Lodge: It is also believed (from some evidence) that the Mount Lodge had been in existence under another banner from 1797 till 1861 when the warrant was surrendered and reconstituted under the new name. If this is right, then the Mount Lodge today is 215 years old!!!

However, the Centenary was celebrated in 1962, 125th year in 1987 and today **150th** (Sesquicentennial) in 2012!!! Our 175th will be in 2037 & Our 200th year will be celebrated in the year **2062!!**

MEETINGS: The Mount Lodge met on the 1st WEDNESDAY of every month till 1906, after which it was changed to the present 1st SATURDAY of every month.

In 1912, the installation month of the Master was shifted from May to NOVEMBER!!!

The Mount Lodge had its own temple in St. Thomas Mount from 1919 and without electricity till 1933! The Mount Lodge donated Rs.15,900/= for the building of the present temple at Egmore. W Bro Raja of Venkatagiri (Master 1918) also donated Rs.15000/=

The Mount Lodge had commenced meeting at FREEMASONS' HALL Egmore from 1967 onwards, as the building at St. Thomas Mount had been taken over by the Ministry of Defence!

The summons did not contain the names of all the members till 1906. In early days summons were well designed with figures of working tools printed in the borders. In 1958 the words MASONRY LIVES TO HELP AND HELPS MEN TO LIVE was added!

The Crest of the Lodge was originally the compasses and the square only!! On 20th March 1909 the crest was enclosed on a board held in the right hand of the Patron Saint!

The Lodge motto MONTES UNDE AUXILLIUM from the three latin words of the first verse of Psalm 2 - means

The hills from whence cometh my help.

The unbroken record till date: In 1950 W Bro PN Sundara Rajan set a record of 17 initiations, 13 passing and 9 raisings!!!

THE HISTORY OF MOUNT LODGE

- > The warrant of the Lodge Mount, 926 EC, was issued inn 1862 and the lodge has been in uninterrupted existence for the past 150 years.
- > There is evidence however to show that the lodge has been in existence, under another banner from 1797 onwards uninterruptedly till 1862 when the warrant was surrendered and the Lodge reconstituted under a new name.
- > If the above is correct, Mount Lodge is now 215 years old.!!!.
- > Given in this volume in another section is the roll of officers of the lodge since 1862 and in this chapter are given the high lights of the activities and incidents of note pertaining to the lodge during its first 100 years. These are extracted and reproduced from the HISTORY OF MOUNT LODGE brought out by the centenary committee in 1962 thanks to the excellent work done in this behalf by W.Bro. R.V.Krishna lyer and W.Bro.P.N.Sundararajan and edited by R.W.Bro. M.Rajagoplan.

FIRST 35 YEARS (1862-1898)

THE CHARTER – The mount lodge 926 EC now No.14 was constituted by a charter granted on 23rd august 1862 by the Grand Master, Earl of Zetland . For a long time the lodge comprised only brethren from Military Ranks who were foreigners on service in India.

Te only other lodges then existing in the city of Madras were Lodge PERFECT UNANIMITY No.150EC and the Lodge UNIVERSAL CHARITY No. 272.

CONSECRATION AND FIRST MASTER

Bro. john Richard Magreth was the first master and he was installed on 24/6/1862 on a local warrant dated 21st June 1862 by the Deputy Grand Master R.W.Bro. Macsonald Richie. The consecration of the lodge and the installation of the First Master appears to have taken placed at the residence of Bro. Magreth.

PRESIDENCY COLLEGE

In 1867 the District grand lodge took part in laying the corner stone of the Presidency College of Madras and Mount Lodge was represented by its master W.Bro.A.J. Filgate. The DGL held an emergency meeting in the nearby PWD buildings Chepauk and went in procession to the college site, where they were received by the Governor of Madras.

MOUNT BRETHERN AS DGM OFFICERS

- ➤ W.Bro.Cunliffe was appointed as DGM on 19/12/1982.
- W.Bro. C.M.J.Moore (Master1882) became Dy.DGM in1886 1888 and DGM in 1891
- > W.Bro C.M.J.Moore installed as DGM, two Governors of Madras, Lord Connemara in 1887 and Lord Ampthill in 1901.
- W.Bro. Charles Scott was DG Secretary from 1865-1868.

- W.Bro. Greaturox from 1868 to 31/08/1901 for a period of 33 1/2 years.
- > W.Bro Greaturox was voted and presented a gold Secretary's jewel by the DGL.

FIRST INDIAN MEMBER

A little over a hundred years ago, in 1884 Bro. S.V. Rajagopalachari, the first Indian Brother was admitted.

THE DECADE NEXT (1899 - 1908)

This decade was a critical period in the history of the lodge. Most of the members then being Military Officers and frequently transferred to various Regiments and other stations, there was till 1902 no brother other than W.Bro. Temple to occupy the chair.

The minutes of this period reveal that on many meetings W.Brethren of Lodge St. George and other City Lodges occupied the Eastern Chair and that some meetings were held without a qualified Master in the Chair!!. W.Bro.Cranshaw joined the lodge in1903 only to be installed Master, since there were no other qualified Brother then.

THE FIRST INDIAN MILITARY OFFICER AS MASTER

W.Bro. Lt. Col. Chatterjee was installed Master in 1904 and he was the first Indian Mater of Military Rank.

CHANGE OF MEETING DAY

The meeting day was changed from 1st Wednesday to 1st Saturday in 1906.

SUMMONS

The summons till 1906 did not contain the names of Members or then address of the Master, only at the Meeting of 2/12/1906 the lodge resolved to print the names in the summons.

INITIATION OF THREE

Three Brethren George Passway, Sgt. Williams Beale and George Stagg were initiated on 3/8/1906.

THE DECADE OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR (1908-1917)

During this period the Lodge changed from a predominantly Military Lodge to a Civilian Membership Lodge.

THREE DEGREES IN THREE WEEKS

Bro. Herbert Audrey - initiated on 1/8/1908, passed on 08/08/1908, raised on 15/08/1908 by the Master acting under rule 185 of the B of C.

In October 1908 Mr. L.T.Edney the chauffer of the Governor of Madras and Mr.Fransis Smithe a clerk of the Governor's household, were balloted for and initiated.

BYE-LAWS

The Bye-laws were revised and approved in 1912 where under an Enquiry Committee was provided for admission of Members.

INSTALLATION

In 1912 the election and installation of the Master was shifted from May to November.

FIRST INDIAN CIVILIAN AS MASTER

Bro. M. Srinivasa Mudaliar initiated on 4/09/1909, was the First Indian Civilian installed as Master in November 1912,50 years after consecration.

FIRST INDIAN SECRETARY.

Bro.T. Hari Rao appointed secretary of the lodge in 1912 after 50 years of consecration.

RAJA OF VENKATAGIRI

Initiated on 7/7/1917. this was an important event in the history of the Lodge, since his munificence to the Lodge and Free masonry enabled the lodge to establish itself on the financial side as well.

THE NEXT DECADE 1918-1927

Raja of Venkatagiri, initiated on 7/7/1917 was made senior warden in November 1917 and installed Master in November 1918.

Owing to building of the upper storey to the Lodge buildings, the meetings were held from February to October 1919 at the temporary Masonic Temple at Commander-in – Chief Road, Egmore.

The first installation in the New Temple at St. Thomas Mount in November 1919 was that of Bro. Jelani Sahib. There was no electricity then.

The Temple was electrified only in 1933

The foundation was laid around 1923 for the Masonic Hall at its present location at Egmore for the building of which the Raja of Venkatagiri made a donation of Rs.15000/-.

The Freemasons Hall was opened on 27/2/1925 by the then Governor of Madras.

Mount Lodge made a collection of Rs. 15900/- and donated for the building of the Freemasons Hall, Egmore.

THE DECADE AFTER 1928-1937

W.Bro. Devasayagam, initiated on 1/6/1904 installed in November 1913 was made

Honorary Member on 1-2-1936.

W.Bro. Jelani donated four of his shares in the Indian Bank to the Lodge for presentation of a gold medal of jewel once in three years to a worthy brother who was regular in attendance. What happened to this endowment is not traceable from the records.

On 2-12-1933 Bro. A.G. Appaswami, who was the Personal Clerk of the Revenue Board Member, R.W. Bro. Archibald Campbell, the then DGM was initiated and the DGM attended and delivered the charge after initiation.

W.Bro. T.S. Varadachari was the 75th Master, installed in November 19366. Despite working in Coimbatore

during his Mastership, he made it a point to to Madras for the Monthly Meetings of the Lodge.

The Lodge became the Founder Member of the Masonic Nursing Home in 1931.

THE DECADE OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR 1938 - 1947

WBro. T.S.Chinthamani, s/o W.Bro. T.S.Varadachari was initiated on 6/5/1939 by his father (who was later installed as the 100th Master of the Lodge in 1961).

WBro. R.V.Krishna Iyer who joined on 4/3/1933, was installed in 1938 and since then he was the guiding spirit of the lodge and occupied the Eastern Chair again in 1952-1953.

WBro. Sir Alexander Macdougal was made Honorary Member in 1939 and he attended the meetings of the Lodge whenever he was in Madras.

The D.G.L. met under the banner of our lodge at our temple at St. Thomas Mount on 22/8/1942 during the Mastership of W. Bro. T.N.S. Raghavachari. Even while the DGL meeting was on, with R.W. Bro. Sir George Boag, DGM in the chair, an explosion in the aerodrome nearby, rocked the building despite which the DGM continued the meeting. It was learnt that there was a mishap to a plane which crashed and that caused the explosion.

Since 1942 it is seen that the Masonic activity and the ritual in the lodge increased and improved thanks to the stewardship of W. Bro. T.A. Srinivasan and R.W.Bro.S.Soundararajan, who were referred to by the DGM, R. W. Bro T.V.Muthukrishna iyer as the TWO GREAT PILLARS.

The Hon. member W. Bro. Alexander Macdougal conducted a ceremony on 8/1/1944.

W.Bro. T.A.Srinivasan initiated on 3/10/1936 was installed in November 1942& was secretary for 5 years treasurer for 2 years and D of C for 5 years.

W.Bro Soundararajan initiated 18/7/1936 was installed in November 1943 and was treasurer for 4 years and secretary for 2 years. He initiated his son W.Bro. K.S.Srinivasan on 4/9/1948& he also installed his son on 1/11/1958.

R.W.Bro. T.V.Muthukrishna iyer was elected Hon/Member on 7/4/1945 during the mastership of W.Bro.V.Krishnamurthy.

The furniture of the lodge was renewed by the members donating therefore.

V.W.Bro K.G.Veeragahvan initiated on 3/2/1940 was installed in November 1946.

He has stood down in November 1945.in favour of W.Bro. T.M. Narayanaswami Pillai, as Masonic gesture. He continued as a member of Mount Lodge till 1986 when he was elected as Hon. Member. He was secretary of the Lodge for 5 years during 1955-1960 and again for 2 spells during 1970-1976. He was the Secretary of the Centenary Celebration Committee and the Chairman of the 125th year celebration committee.

During the Mastership of W.Bro. N.Rangachari, (1947 -1948) the Lodge passed a resolution expressing its sorrow and grief at the assassination of Mahatma Gandhi, the apostle of truth and Non-violence.

THE DECADE AFTER INDEPENDENCE 1948 - 1957

- > The meeting of 5th june was adjourned for want of quorum.
- During this decade the names of W.Bros. K.S.Srinivasan, S.P.S. Rajan, M.K.Sridharan, R.S.D. Monte S.K.Ramanujam & Watts deserve mention of their services to the Lodge.
- W.Bro.P.N.Soundararajan initiated on 1/4/1944 by R.W.Bro. T V. Muthu Krishna Iyer, was installed on November 1950 & during his mastership there were 17 initiations,13 passing and 9 risings & the lodge reported NIL arrears..
- > The credit for this also goes to Bro. K.S.Srinivasan who, along with the Master went door to door collecting the dues.
- > The Lodge started a study circle on 19/1/1952 inaugurated by the DGM. After 2 years of activity the circle became dormant.

NEARING THE CENTENARY 1958 – 1960

Bro.E. Cooper Sergent of King Institute, Guindy, initiated on 5/5/1917 was Jr. Warden in 1921. He was the Tyler of the Lodge for over 33 years till 1956.

W.Bro. K.S.Srinivasan during his Mastership made a change in the design of the summons and made a new Banner for the Lodge.

W.Bro. M. K.Sridharan was initiated in November 1960 and conducted the affairs of the lodge with felicity and purpose..

He installed the 100th Master W.Bro.T.S.Chinthamani.

This was the last installation Meeting under then English Constitution in November 1961.

During the Mastership of W.Bro.Chinthamani for the first time, the Permanent Committee presented top the Lodge budget estimates for the year.

At the meeting of 7/4/1962 W.Bro. Raghavachari re-joined, took the Eastern Chair and initiated his son R. Dwarakanath.

THUS ENDED THE 100 YEARS.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE POST CENTENARY 25 YEARS

Centenary Celebrations

The Centenary Celebrations were held at an Emergency meeting of the Lodge by Dispensation on 25th August, 1962, at 6.30 p.m. at the Lodge temple at St.Thomas Mount, Madras. W.Bro.T.S.Chinthamani and his officers were present.

Forty two members and 87 distinguishing visitors attended the celebrations. The MW The Grand master W.Bro.Bhogilal Shah and R.W.Bro.P.M.Sundaram, Deputy Grand Master and R.W.Bro.S.T.Srinivasagopalachari, RGM, participated. Despite its being August, there were heavy rains on that day.

RGL Meetings - The Regional Grand Lodge Annual Investiture Meeting was held under the Banner of Mount Lodge in February 1972, (W.Bro.V.Somasundaram WM) and again in February 1985 (W.Bro.Vijay Rangachari).

Installation Meetings - Till 1966, at the Installation ceremony, there were perambulations and proclamations in each of the three degrees and working tools of each of the three degrees were also presented. Since 1967, this has been discontinued.

The Charges to the Master, Warden and Brethren of the Lodge on the installation night from the installation of Bro.R.Vaidyanathan in November 1990 is being given by the Past Masters of the Lodge.

Joint Meetings - Joint Meetings of all City Lodges were held in 1972 and again in 1983.

Ceremonies – In almost all meetings, till 1970, there were atleast 2 ceremonies either initiation and passing or passing and raising and atleast two candidates were jointly initiated, passed or raised.

W.Bro.M.Rajagopalan conducted ceremonies of all three degrees on the same day.

W.Bro.G.Watts initiated two, passed two and raised two on the same day.

Three fellow crafts were raised by dispensation on 11.7.1966 by W.Bro.G.Watts and W.Bro.M.P.Sarathy in July 1975.

Bye – Laws – The Bye-laws revised, passed and confirmed by the Lodge in September 1985 was approved by the Grand Lodge of India in December 1985.

Contest in Election of Master – There was a contest for election of Master for the year 1961-62 when Bro.M.Rajagopalan was elected by majority over Bro.A.Sarangapani and again in 1966-67 when Bro.Wattes was elected by a majority over Bro.R.K.Nagaraj.

Installation Banquets - Installation Banquets were cancelled on the following occasions and for the following reasons:

November 1985 Due to W.Bro.T.S.Chinthamani having been called to the Grand Lodge Above 3 days prior.

Past Masters Night – The annual Past Master Night, when the Past Masters of Lodge took the offices of the Lodge and conducted the ceremonies of the meeting was commenced for the first time at the Meeting on 7th June 1969. Since 1973 it is the meeting of October each year and is regularly observed.

Newsletters - The Grand Lodge Newsletter first appeared in September 1965.

The Mount Lodge Newsletter appeared for the first time on 7-12-1968 with W.Bro.Rajagopalan as Editor. After a break of 2 months it reappeared in April 1969 and again went out of circulation since July 1969. It was revived and appeared for a few months during 1978 under the editorship of W.Bro.K.G.Veeraraghavan. Since December 1984, the Newsletter under the title of "MOUNTTIDINGS" is regularly appearing as part of the summons under the editorship of W.Bro.R.Dwarakanath.

Funeral Lodge Service – An abridged form of Funeral Lodge Service was conducted on 6-4-1968 for R.W.Bro.S.T.Srinivasagopalachari, Honorary Member of the Lodge.

Funeral Lodge Service was conducted on 8-5-1983 for W.Bro. N.G.Rajan who was a Past Master of the Lodge.

Again in 1986, a Funeral Lodge Service was conducted for W.Bro.T.S.Chinthamani, Past Master and 100th Master of the Lodge.

Death of Master while in office – W.Bro.A.Sarangapani installed on 2-11-1963 died in June 1964 while in Office and I.P.M. W.Bro.M.Rajagopalan assumed office for the remainder of the year.

Consecration of Lodges Sponsored – The application for "Lodge Vidya 164" was "recommended" by Lodge Mount in 1961.

"Lodge Bharathi 161" sponsored by Mount Lodge was consecrated on 7-2-1964.

"Lodge Srinivasagopala 190" sponsored by Mount Lodge was consecrated on 21-8-1969.

"Lodge Mount Charity 232" sponsored by Mount Lodge was consecrated on 6-1-1978 by the M.W.The Grand Master assisted by Grand Masters of New Belgium, Western Australia and China.

Lodge Building – Military Estates Officer issued notice to resume title to the land on which the Lodge Building was situate in St. Thomas Mount and offered compensation of Rs. 71,920/-.

At its March 1966 meeting, Lodge agreed to accept the compensation and constituted a Committee to negotiate for additional compensation.

The Lodge held its last meeting in its own premises on 7-5-1966 and thereafter held its meeting by dispensation at the Freemasons Hall, Egmore, Madras.

The meeting on 3-6-1967 was held at No.21, GST Road, St.Thomas Mount, the premises belonging to and offered by Bro.K.Satyendra Kumar. Installation meetings however continued to be held at the Freemasons Hall, Egmore, Madras.

THE SEVEN LIBERAL ARTS & SCIENCES:

A Stroll through By, Richard D. Marcus, F & AM

The study of the Liberal Arts and Sciences, which are grammar, rhetoric, logic, arithmetic, geometry, music, and astronomy, when we study the historical background for this list, we will uncover layers of Masonic meanings for us in each of the seven areas of knowledge.

Parts of the original list date back to ancient Greece. By medieval times, the completed list had become central to educators and scholastics. The following remarkable woodblock print symbolically captures the relationship of knowledge to crafts.



This print is German from about AD 1500. It shows a goddess holding a book and a rod. She is called Wisdom or Sophia. The love of wisdom or the "philio of Sophia" is the meaning of the word Philosophy. We see Wisdom's lifeblood pouring into all of the arts and crafts drawn as young men. All knowledge is united in this illustration. Painters, architects, musicians, and soldiers receive Wisdom.

This leads us to a second woodblock print, which also is German from about the same time. This one includes clear words representing the Seven Liberal Arts and Sciences. Once again a book and rod, symbols of a teacher, are held by a three-headed winged Wisdom. She oversees seven maidens.



In AD 420, Marcianus Capella in Carthage wrote an allegory of the Phoebus-Apollo, God of the Sun, presenting the Seven Liberal Arts as maids to his bride Philology, a lover of words. Thereafter, artists have illustrated the liberal arts and sciences as maids. The maids congregate around Wisdom. Knowledge is drawn within a circle. Above Wisdom are morals and theology. In the bottom corners are Aristotle and possibly Plato. But the central figures are the Seven Liberal Arts and Sciences.

Grammar

In Genesis, the first job given to Adam is to name all things. Adam is told to name them and to have dominion over creation. Knowing the name of things gives a man authority to speak and to understand.

In elementary school or Grammar School we learn to recite the alphabet, numbers, and colors. Grammar involves words and meanings. The earliest lessons in speaking involve repetition and alliteration. We say tongue twisters and recite phrases to learn to speak. We say, "she sells sea shells by the seashore" as an articulation exercise. Children learn their own language as well as foreign languages. To learn another language, grammar and structure are essential.

Grammar can be divided into technical or exegetical grammar. Technical grammar is what most of us associate with the word grammar — diagramming sentences with subjects and verbs. Grammar involves learning declensions for verbs and nouns. Butexegetical grammar involves learning the meaning of words, their nuances, and how they fit in different settings.

We learn that deferential language is appropriate to use for speaking to those in authority over us. We are told to keep a tongue of good report in the FC Charge. The FC historical lecture directs us to have an instructive tongue so that we become better men. Grammar teaches us to speak clearly and concisely.

Rhetoric

A synonym for rhetoric is persuasion. To study rhetoric is to study speaking and writing to persuade others. Too often we think of rhetoric as unimportant, as in the throwaway line, "well that was just a rhetorical comment." Rhetoric is serious business: it has substance. Rhetoric is essential in the study of law and regulations. Roscoe Pound, Albert Mackey, and Allen Roberts were some of the greatest writers on Masonic jurisprudence. They were marvelously persuasive writers as well.

Influential Romans learned to speak in public with fluency and oratory. Newly initiated Entered Apprentices are invited to speak in Lodge on whatever was on their hearts. Public speaking is terrifying to some: but to Freemasons, we learn both to speak to listen to others.

Rhetoric adds force and elegance to our thoughts. As we improve in rhetoric, we captivate the hearer with both the strength of our arguments and the beauty of our expression. Our mastery of rhetoric teaches us to entreat and exhort our brethren to acts of charity. Skillful rhetoric uses tact to admonish our brothers. Rhetoric weaves praise to applicate an conduct or deportment.

Logic

Logic directs and guides us after truth. It consists of a regular train of argument where we deduce or infer from the facts. Logic leads us to conclusions based on our knowledge.

We use all of our faculties of conceiving, judging, reasoning, and disposing of questions before us. Logic trains the mind to think clearly. We are charged to be good men and true. Sincerity and plain dealing should distinguish any Mason.

Dialectics is the term used to describe critical thinking. We weigh the pros and cons to find the better choice. We observe the world. As we see patterns and relationships, we begin to make predictions using inductive reasoning. Dialectics guides us to make proofs or syllogisms.

Early on, we find that you can disprove assertions easier than prove them. Reductio ad absurdum means to find a contradiction that proves the opposite. It is easy to disprove, "all elephants can fly," simply by finding one that can't. A single observation proves that, "not all elephants can fly."

The education of our minds includes proofs and deductive reasoning. We start to see actions that help one person may not help all. We learn to avoid arguments that something is true or false simply by who says it, instead of its inherent truth.

As we advance in logic, we begin to think about proofs for the existence of God. We see the beauty of an autumn leave, so intricate and perfect. The teleological proof of God's existence is that design in nature proves that there must have been a designer, our Great Architect Of The Universe.

Arithmetic

Arithmetic involves computation or reckoning with numbers. Ignorance of numbers leaves many things unintelligible. To perceive the world accurately, we need facility with counting and measurement. Mathematics is taught step by step. We first learn to count before we learn to add and subtract. As a science, it is progressive by building skill and familiarity through frequent practice.

We develop abstract operations such as addition and multiplication:

For the Freemason, the application of this science is to:

- Add to your knowledge
- > Never subtract from the character of your neighbor
- > Multiple your benevolence to your fellow creatures & Divide your means with those in need.

Arithmetic offers a structured system. In has rules, order, and operates in terms of equations. Balance and equality are principles learned in arithmetic that should remind us to act on the level.

There is beauty in arithmetic and mathematics. We discover symmetry and proportion. Numbers fascinates us. Leonardo Fibonacci in AD 1201 discovered that rabbits reproduced in a series of 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, and 13. Ratios of any two successive numbers approach the Golden Mean, which is 1.618. The inverse of 1.618 is .618. The same digits reappear. The Parthenon was built on this same proportion of the length 161.8% of the height.

We feel awe and wonder at the beauty of mathematics. We find fractal patterns in biology, chemistry, and physics that are repeated. The Fibonacci spiral is found in conch shells

Mathematics shows that some propositions are right, and some are wrong. It indirectly teaches us about morality. There is no moral relativity here.



Geometry

Geometry concatenates geo and metric, or earth measurement, within it. Geometry discovers unmeasured areas by comparing them to areas already measured. Geometry is synonymous with self-knowledge, the understanding of the basic substance of our being. Freemasonry places special emphasis on geometry.

The tools of geometry are plumbs, squares, and levels. They are the basic tools of operative Masons. We use them in speculative Masonry to teach lessons of right-behavior, rectitude, and truthfulness. Our conductor in the FC degree leads us much like the apprentice is led by a Master of his trade.

The sense of seeing is developed in Geometry. We grow in perceiving which structures are in order and which ones are not well arranged. We acknowledge that geometric is the foundation of architecture.

Music

Music is the sixth of the seven Liberal Arts and Sciences. Pythagoras and his followers were keen on studying music as a science.

Music is part of us. Our heartbeat is the basic pattern, with sounds ranging from the first cry of a newborn baby to our last gasp for breath. The sense of hearing is improved, so that we recognize ditties and rhythms and syncopation. Clapping and singing are part of who were are as humans.

Vibrations cause sounds. Pitch is determined by the frequency of the vibrations. We learn to hear major, minor, and chromatic scales. We attempt to match the pitch of the lead singer. It takes discipline, but we achieve harmony. Many have sought to hear the sounds of the universe in radio frequency. Whole pieces of music have been dedicated to the music of the spheres.

Astronomy

Astronomy is last in this list of Arts and Sciences as we contemplate the stars and planets, and yes, the great architect of the universe.

Time and space seem to dwarf us. We feel tiny as we look at the Milky Way. Often it is said that the Fear of God

is the Beginning of Wisdom. Looking at the universe helps to instill both fear and a sense of the glory of the universe.

The globes teach us to understand the rotation of the earth around the sun and the diurnal rotation of the earth. Daylight shrinks in the days before December 22nd, and then begins to lengthen. We observe this. Times and seasons are understood by contemplating astronomy.

The Seven Liberal Arts & Sciences are branches of Wisdom or Learning. If we are to become better men, we should work on becoming better, able to understand our world.

These seven are key to learning other areas of knowledge including history and psychology. These branches are like rooms in a magnificent garden in which we should daily stroll.

SYMBOLISM & MASONRY

Freemasonry is "veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols" because these are the surest way by which moral and ethical truths may be taught. It is not only with the brain and with the mind that the initiate must take Freemasonry but also with the heart

Freemasonry is a science of symbols, in which, by their proper study, a search is instituted after truth - that truth consisting in the knowledge of the divine and human nature, of God and the human soul

Symbolism is the use and interpretation of symbols or emblems. Literally, a symbol is a comparison. The word symbol is derived from two Greek words meaning to throw together, to place side by side. Thus, "a symbol is a visible representation of some object or thing, real or imagined, employed to convey a certain idea."

We have no other way to express ideas than by the use of symbols. Words themselves are only symbols. When we say a man is "lion-hearted," we use symbolism. In ordinary usage, however, by symbol we mean an object which stands for an idea. The Flag is a symbol of our Country; the Cross is a symbol of Christianity; the Square is a Masonic symbol of Virtue.

Extending this conception further, ceremonies and actions may also be symbolic. The military salute is a symbol of obedience and discipline. A hearty handclasp may symbolize several ideas, friendship, faith, sympathy. Kneeling for prayer is a symbol of humility, submission, obedience-reverence.

A great Masonic scholar once said that "the symbolism of Masonry is the soul of Masonry." This becomes apparent when we realize that it is not enough merely to state ideas; they must be driven home with emphasis which not only will impress but also will be retained by the candidate's mind. So these ideas, garnered from the wisdom of the ages, are represented by symbols.

"Freemasonry is rehearsed to the candidate by the rendition of ritual, imparted to his mind by story and impressed upon the memory by symbols. By drama, story and symbol, the eye, the ear and the recollection continually enrich the mind and quicken the conscience of the thinking members of the Craft."

MASONIC CHARITY

It is a Freemasons duty to support and encourage the principles of Freemasonry, because it powerfully develops all social and benevolent affections

The very form of a Lodge, as you have learned, is limited only by the vastness of the universe. Masonic Charity should be equally extensive and this refers to Charity in its broadest sense. Therefore, one of the basic tenets of a Mason's profession is Relief.

A Brother should lose no time in becoming acquainted with this magnificent, living example of Masonic benevolence. But our Masonic Home is by no means the end of Masonic Charity. True, it is one very important means to an end—for here, as Masons, we collectively extend Masonic benevolence on a scale which far surpasses our abilities as separate individuals or Lodges. The Masonic Home is thus an outstanding example of what can be accomplished when many thousands of individuals each contribute a modest sum (the per capita fee and individual donations) to create a very substantial fund which is impartially administered for a common cause.

Yet, payment of the Home per capita does not absolve a Mason or a Lodge from the further practice of Masonic Charity wherever and whenever it may be needed, within the terms of our obligations—for every Mason has solemnly promised to "aid and assist all worthy, distressed Master Masons, their widows and orphans" when they apply to him within the broad meaning of the obligation he has taken—and this applies equally to Lodges, of course. This responsibility never ceases, and it is not restricted within tangible boundaries. Thus Masonic Charity actually is, or should be, as boundless as the universe.

The Mason who understands this fully and practices Charity in its broadest sense in his daily life—thereby discharging his Masonic obligation—soon discovers why Charity has been called "the greatest of these;" and his reward is that inward peace which surpasses all understanding.

The sparrow, especially the common house sparrow, is the smallest bird of our macro and micro eco-systems. One of the most ubiquitous birds on earth and also one of the oldest companions of human beings, it has, over a period of time, evolved with us. Fortunately, they are still found in abundance in many parts of the world.

The house sparrow was once the most common bird in the world, but in the past few years, this bird has been on the decline, both in the urban and rural habitats. The decline of the house sparrow is an indicator of the continuous degradation the environment around us is facing. It is also a warning bell that alerts us about the possible detrimental effects on our health and wellbeing. We need to know the health risks of the increasing amount of microwave pollution and what is decimating the population of the house sparrow, which co-existed with us, so that we can estimate the effect on all forms of life, including ours. Concerned over the dwindling species of the common sparrow who connect you to nature as a child and leave a lasting indelible impression on us, sparrow lovers from all over the world commemorate WSD (World Sparrow Day) on March 20th annually to tweak our conscience and protect this specie from the brink of extinction. This event is organized to raise public awareness about the decline of the house sparrow and throw light on the problems faced by the species in its daily fight for survival, and also inspire people to take concrete steps in housing them in the abode of nature."

Taking a cue from nature lovers all over the world, brethren from the The Mount Lodge No.14 under the aegis of their beloved Worshipful Master W.Bro. M Balaganesh took the initiative of spearheading the "Save the sparrow" campaign. WHAT'S IN A NAME?

"A rose is a rose," it has been said. And most of us know a rose when we see one, as we know the African marigolds we plant beside the potatoes and beans in our gardens, and the cedar, mango, coconut and palm trees, banyan and neem trees that shade our backyards and line our streets. We usually call these plants by their common names. But if we wanted to know more about the cedar tree in our front yard, we would find that "cedar" may refer to an eastern red cedar, an incense cedar, a western red cedar, an Atlantic white cedar, a Spanish cedar, a banak cedar, or the biblical cedar of Lebanon. In fact, we would find that cedars are found in three separate plant families.

Later, after discovering that our "African" marigolds are in fact from Mexico and our "Spanish" cedar originated in the West Indies, we would realize how misleading the common names of plants can be. The same plant can have many different common names. The European white lily has at least 245, while the marsh marigold has at least 280. Clearly, if we use only the common name of a plant, we cannot be sure of understanding very much about that plant.

It is for this reason that the scientific community prefers to use a more precise way of naming, or classification. Scientific classification, however, is more than just naming: it is a key to understanding. Botanists name a plant to give it a unique place in the biological world, as well as to clarify its relationships within that world. Classification is sometimes difficult. As modern botany has advanced, producing an increasing understanding of complex biochemical mechanisms, the criteria for the way plants are classified has undergone transformation. Even further, Nature is not fixed and plants, like us, are capable of change. Plants can vary for reasons we don't entirely understand. To be sure, plant classification is not the dull field that some might assume!

The scientific or botanical name of a plant is the means by which we give it its unique place in the scientific and biological world. Begun by Carolus Linneaus, a Swedish botanist, in the eighteenth century, this name is binomial (has two parts), consisting of genus and species, both of which are expressed in Latin. The genus or generic name is a noun which usually names some aspect of a plant, such as Coffea, the Latinized form of the

Arabic word for beverage, kahwah. The species or specific name is usually an adjective that describes the genus. In the case of coffee, the species is arabica, indicating that the plant was thought to originate in Arabia. The coffee plant botanical name, Coffea arabica, refers to only one plant and cannot be confused with any other. Its botanical name is unique to that particular plant the world over.

Despite the great advances made in botany, there are many, many plants yet to be discovered, classified, and utilized; unknown plants are treasures waiting to be found. Today's ethnobotanists are combing regions of the world, looking for tomorrow's medicines and food crops. They are exploring the functional properties and relationships of plants within ecosystems to help us to understand the need for diversity in the way we manage our plant resources.

The plant world, our world, is in constant flux. Due to human and other factors, we are seeing the possibility of extinction for many plants and animals. Plant classification aids in keeping track of our planet's endangered inhabitants. Just as importantly, we are realizing the need to understand ecological systems which preserve biodiversity. Today's scientists are exploring how genetic diversity and ecological sensitivity are necessary in solving such problems as feeding the population and fighting disease. Plant classification is vital to these endeavors. As is plain to see, a name is not just a name.

As a matter of interest in preserving and conserving the abundant flora surrounding the Freemason premises, The Mount Lodge No.14 under the able leadership of Worshipful Master W.Bro. M Balaganesh and his effervescent team of brethren set about enthusiastically in their task of classifying the trees in the premises ably assisted by botanist Mr. M Udayakumar. The event which was held on 16th September, 2012 was done with much joy and care in not only educating themselves but also to let the future generation of Freemasons realize and appreciate the vast wealth of abundant nature left for them to enjoy, preserve, conserve and grow. Name placards suitably numbered with their botanical and colloquial names in English and Tamil have been made to classify the trees which would enrich our botanical knowledge.
